A logical solipsism

A truth-functional perspective is a commonly accepted paradigm of understanding and developing of logic. Such an approach reduces a sentence to its logical value. It means that logic does not deal with our thinking – we think by sentence's contents and not by truth values. Despite this, it is considered that there is no logic outside truth-functional logic, for example, Kahneman's fast thinking is considered to be illogical although there are well known heuristics (psychological rules) of this thinking. It is a kind of solipsism, the consequence of which are various problems and paradoxes that are easy to avoid. It is enough to give up the paradigm mentioned.
